## FIELD DAY FINAL SCORES

The final GSARA score for Field Day was 3011. For comparison, our score last year was only 1918 under the same 2F category. Under CW contacts, we made 82 on 80, 239 on 40, 70 on 20, and 28 on 15 for a total of 419 CW QSOs. On phone we made 49 contacts on 80, 25 on 40, 698 on 20, 25 on 15 and 8 on 6 for a total of 872 phone QSOs. We also made 2 digital QSOs on 40m. The GOTA station made 67 of our total phone QSOs. We had 21 participants. We missed only, "Formal NTS message handling" and a formal "Educational activity" for bonuses. A big "THANK YOU" to all the participants and CONGRATULATIONS for a job well done!

JULY 18 MEETING**

President Frank Wroblewski, W2XYZ called the meeting to order at 7:30 PM at the Red Cross. There were 10 members and three guests present. The guests were Hunter Suffill, son of W2HTS from Eatontown, Art Goldberg, KC2CRI from Freehold, and Paul Strongoli from Howell. After the pledge to the flag, all present introduced themselves.

Secretary's Report

A motion was made by Jeff, N2LXM and seconded by Howard, W2HTS to accept the secretary's report from the last meeting as published in the July Propagator. The motion passed unanimously.

Treasurer's Report

Bruce, K2QXW gave the treasurers report. A motion was made by Howard, W2HTS and seconded by Jeff, N2LXM to accept the report. The motion passed unanimously.

Field Day

GSARA Field Day was successful with outstanding participation enabling us to keep two stations on the air for the entire 24 hours. Our GOTA station also made a significant number of contacts. We ended up with 419 CW contacts, 2 PSK31 contacts, and 939 phone contacts. This is almost three times as many contacts as we made last year but our final score will be less than 1.5 times what it was last year because we ran high power and lost the power multiplier of 2. Considering how poor the bands were, the members are to be commended for a job well done!

The fiberglass poles used to support the two-element loop antenna had a lot of tape adhesive that had to be removed. Although a Saturday clean-up session was planned, Jim, K2EI came in early and cleaned it up all by himself. THANK YOU, Jim.

Old Business

A severe storm on July 7 caused extensive damage in Atlantic County in southern New Jersey and the Red Cross asked GSARA to help in

trying to establish communications with the Red Cross down there. Several members turned out and got W2GSA on the air but results were not outstanding. Jeff, N2LXM finally established communication but it was quite limited since the amateurs in Atlantic were busy responding to the damage caused from the storm.

It was suggested that better documentation of the capabilities at the Red Cross would be useful in times (like this one) when neither Frank, W2XYZ nor Howard, W2HTS is available.

For those interested in purchasing a GSARA shirt, jacket, or sweatshirt, there is a sign-up sheet in the W2GSA radio shack. We need at least 8 items before an order can be placed.

New Business

Paul Strongoli was a guest at the meeting and expressed an interest in getting an amateur radio license. Study guides were recommended and he was invited to visit the W2GSA shack after the meeting to learn a little more about amateur radio.

A second Kenwood TS-930 transceiver was donated to the GSARA by Arnold, AB2N. Arek, AC2FC fixed the other one by repairing the power supply, drivers, and finals. So, we now have two working TS-930 transceivers.

New Members

An application for membership was received from Ray Irwin, WA2FFT from Oakhurst. He holds a General class license and is active on HF, VHF, and UHF. He is particularly interested in antenna design and computers. By unanimous vote, Ray was voted into the GSARA.

An application for membership was also received from Art Goldberg, KC2CRI from Freehold. He holds a General class license and is active on HF with an FT-950. He is retired from the NJ Department of Environmental Protection. By unanimous vote, Art was voted into the GSARA.

The International Lighthouse/Lightship weekend is August 17-19. Jeff, N2LXM is trying to get permission to operate from Twin Lights but

The next GSARA Hamfest will be on Saturday, September 22 at the usual location.



### **WALT MAXWELL, W2DU - SK**



Walt Maxwell, W2DU (SK)

M. Walter Maxwell, W2DU, died July 3 at his home in DeLand, Florida, of natural causes. He was 93. Maxwell was best known in the Amateur Radio realm for his ground-breaking series of articles, "Another Look at Reflections." Published in QST in seven parts from 1973-1976, the series explained in plain English concepts such as line loss, SWR, baluns and antenna tuners. The articles were later compiled into a book, *Reflections: Transmission Lines and Antennas*, which included additional material on matching networks,

antennas and the Smith Chart. It was first published by the ARRL in 1990 and went through several editions. Later editions were published by CQ Communications. Read more here.

Patrick Brian Reagan, 65, died on Sunday, July 15, 2012 at the Somerset Medical Center in Somerville. ### **RWANDA & BANGLADESH OK**

ARRL DXCC Manager Bill Moore, NC1L, reports that two operations -- the 9X0PY (Rwanda) operation (December 24, 2011-January 7, 2012) and the S21YD (Bangladesh) operation (1994, 1995, 1998 and 1999) -- have been approved for DXCC credit. "If you have had these operations rejected in a recent application, please send an e-mail to the ARRL DXCC Desk," Moore said. "When responding, please include the reference number on your credit slip (found in the upper right hand portion) to help expedite retrieval. Please note that due to heavy e-mail volume, you may not receive a reply. Once updated, results will appear in Logbook of The World (LoTW) accounts, as well as online in the daily listings."

## INFOAGE WWII SYMPOSIUM

At that time the rocket team was sent to White Sands Proving Ground and the radar and communications group came to Fort Monmouth New Jersey - Camp Evans.



#### **Radio Proximity Fuze - Secret Weapon of WWII** - Ray Chase - NJARC

This ground breaking technological development of WWII had been previously used against German V1 attacks on London and Japanese fighter and Kamikaze attacks in the Pacific with devastating results. Hear and see how this wartime crash program broke all existing barriers in electronics miniaturization and ruggedness. Camp Evans had a part to play in this endeavor.



#### **The Secret Beacon that Saved Lives** - Fred Carl - Director



This presentation will review the amazing Camp Evans Rebecca / Eureka beacon system with photos and stories. Very few people are privy to the details of this amazing invention. The system made a critical difference in the success of D-Day Pathfinders; it supported underground and spy activities, and helped keep the American forces surrounded during the Battle of the Bulge supplied.

#### **Tactical Communications Security** - Al Klase - NJARC



Many people are aware of the famous "Enigma" machine, the premier Nazi encryption device of WWII. But many may not be aware that it was important for Army tactical field units not to disclose critical information to the enemy, especially before important maneuvers. The Signal Corps embarked on a program to produce cipher machines to encode information prior to transmission. This presentation describes some of that equipment and its usage on the battlefield.

## COLORADO HAMS HELP IN DISASTER

Thanks to an extremely dry season, portions of Colorado have been ravaged by wildfires. As of July 5, only a handful of the fires are considered extinguished or fully contained, with the majority considered still active. According to InciWeb, almost 170,000 acres are affected by 11 active fires. Since June 9 -- when the High Park Fire, the first of the wildfires began -- hams in Colorado have been assisting with disaster communications, providing communications support to the State and served agencies. ## MAN FINED FOR INTERFERENCE

On July 17, the FCC announced that it had issued a *Notice of Apparent Liability for Forfeiture and Order* in the amount of \$12,500 to Glenn S. Yamada, of Kenai, Alaska. Yamada is accused of "apparently willfully and repeatedly violat[ing] Section 301 of the *Communications Act of 1934, as amended*, and Sections 95.409(a) and 95.411(a)(1) and (b) of the FCC Rules by operating his CB radio without requisite Commission authorization." In January 2012, the FCC received a complaint regarding interference to an authorized user in the aeronautical band -- a safety of life service -- on 21.964 MHz. According to the FCC, the complaint "Concerned a male subject talking and interfering with the control and monitoring of air traffic over the North Atlantic." The FCC's High Frequency Direction Finding Center (HFDFC) monitored the frequency over the next few days, and on January 31, "observed a subject matching the details of the compliant transmitting on the frequency 21.965 MHz." The HFDFC noted that the subject was using the call "1600 Alaska," that the actual operating frequency was 27.025 (CB channel 6) and that the transmissions were coming from Kenai. ## UNLICENSED HAM FINED \$17,000

On July 2, the FCC issued a Notice of Apparent Liability for Forfeiture and Order in the amount of \$17,000, accusing Brian R. Ragan, KF6EGI, of Suisun City, California, of "apparently willfully and repeatedly violating" the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, by operating an unlicensed radio transmitter on frequency 104.9 MHz and failing to allow an inspection of his station by FCC personnel. The Commission said that Ragan, "as a licensed Amateur Radio operator for at least six years, [he] should be aware that any radio equipment at his station must be made available for inspection at any time when requested by the FCC, and also should be aware of the proper operation of his amateur station in accordance with the Rules." ## ASTRONAUT CHATS WITH ARRL

NASA Astronaut Don Pettit, KD5MDT, sat down with ARRL News Editor S. Khrystyne Keane, K1SFA, on Thursday, July 12, for a one-on-one interview about ham radio and life on the International Space Station (ISS). Pettit returned from the ISS on July 1 where he served as part of Expedition 31, spending 193 days in space. He first ventured into space in 2002 on the space shuttle Endeavour as part of Expedition 6, logging more than 161 days in space. In 2008, he was a part of the crew on STS-126, also on Endeavour. Pettit holds the distinction of spending 370 days in space, placing him fourth among US space fliers for the longest time in space. Read more [here](#).

## EXECUTIVE ORDER NO THREAT

On July 6, 2012, the White House released an Executive Order that addresses National Security and Emergency Preparedness (NS/EP) communications functions of the federal government. Contrary to some concerns raised in a few Amateur Radio circles, the Order does not appear to contain any threat to the Amateur Service or its ability to continue support communications during times of emergency or disaster. It also poses no threat to amateur spectrum.

"The purpose of the new entity, which would be created by this Order within the Executive Branch, appears to be to plan for future NS/EP communications and to ensure survivability, hardness and interoperability, as well as to develop a long-term strategic plan for NS/EP communications," said ARRL Regulatory Information Manager Dan Henderson, N1ND. "Based on the Amateur Service's ongoing, positive working relationship with officials at the Department of Homeland Security's Office of Emergency Communications, it is hard to envision that any new management plan would not include Amateur Radio. Nothing in this Order directly affects Amateur Radio's daily operations." A good summary of the content of the Order can be found here.

## LOTW SUPPORTS CQ WPX



The wait is over! After weeks of beta testing, the ARRL launched the integration of Logbook of The World (LoTW) -- its electronic confirmation system -- with CQ Magazine's Worked All Prefixes (WPX) Award on Monday, July 2. The WPX Award is the

first of the CQ-sponsored awards that LoTW will support. More than 51,000 radio amateurs worldwide use Logbook of The World, and there are currently almost 432 million QSOs in the LoTW system. Read more here.

## PRB-1 IN ILLINOIS

Following in the footsteps of various other states, Illinois Governor Pat Quinn signed HB 1390 -- a state-level PRB-1 law -- on June 30, effective immediately. PRB-1 (as codified in Section 97.15(b)) was released by the FCC in 1985 and states that "[s]tate and local regulation of a station antenna structure must not preclude amateur service communications. Rather, it must reasonably accommodate such communications with minimum practicable regulation." Read more here.

## PRB-1 EXTENSION DENIED

In January 2012, Leonard Umina, W7CCE, of Gilbert, Arizona, filed a Petition for Rulemaking, asking the FCC to "expand its policy of limited preemption of state and local regulations governing amateur station facilities to preempt private land use regulations such as covenants, conditions, and restrictions (CC&Rs) and rental agreements that limit amateur licensees' ability to deploy antennas."
