Various semaphores and flags were used. The Morse electrical telegraph was installed at Highlands around 1853 so ship information could be sent to Manhattan directly after that time. The Navesink lighthouse and later the Twin Lights lighthouse played significant roles in this activity throughout the years. A very interesting program!

He was a graduate of Long Branch High School, class of 1943 and served with honor in the US Navy during World War II as an aviation radioman from 1943 until 1946. George held an Extra Class Amateur license and was a long-time member of the Quarter Century Wireless Association Marconi Chapter 138. For years he was a regular check-in to the QCWA News net on Tuesday nights.

William Shaw, W2WVA of Yonah Mountain, Georgia, passed away Saturday, November 01, 2014 which was his 89th birthday and also All Saints Day. He was with his beloved daughters, Christine Shaw Mitchell and Wendy Ann Micari and his family. William was born in Hell's Kitchen, a corner of Manhattan to British parents. He was very proud of his dual citizenship, 'British by law of blood, American by law of soil.' He served in the US Army during **World War II**. He earned the **Bronze Star** and **Purple Heart** for his heroic actions on the French-German border in December of 1944. After the war William earned a degree in Electrical Engineering and worked in that capacity for Bell Labs for many years until his retirement. He was the trustee of Crawford Hill VHF Club station W2NFA for many years. William was a contributing technical editor for 'Law and Order' an international law enforcement magazine; advanced amateur ham radio operator; and a lifelong marksman. CW IMPROVEMENT GROUP

I am happy to announce a new program which you are invited to participate in. Have you ever wanted to learn CW or improve your CW skills? Many of us once had that skill but, over the years, lost it as we didn't practice. Many of us have come to depend on the CW readers run by our computer or radio, or we simply migrated to other modes and when we hear the sweet tweets of CW, we can't translate them! Well, now GSARA is happy to announce the creation of the **CW IMPROVEMENT GROUP**. Here is how it will work.

Each member of GSARA is encouraged to either learn Morse or improve their Morse. On the honor system, each participant whose code is rusty, weak or non-existent, will determine his or her current speed and sometime in April will determine their new speed. The one with the most improvement from their slowest speed (i.e., someone who starts at 3 WPM and gets up to 15 WPM) will win a prize (to be determined) but all participants will be recognized by the club for their achievement. The element of competition is minimal and the rewards of learning the Code are great.

So how do you want to learn the Code? There are so many methods, it is hard to count. Luckily there are many computer programs out there and they can be found at this link: http://www.dxzone.com/catalog/Software/Morse_Code_Training/. Browse the list and find something you are comfortable with. Cy, K2CYS will be happy to work with you if you are unable to determine which program may be right for you. As well, the code practice files from the American Radio Relay League (ARRL) can be downloaded here for practice on your iPod or computer: <http://www.arrl.org/code-practice-files>. Of course, there is nothing like hearing Code from the ether itself and W1AW, the ARRL station transmits it most days. The schedule can be found here: <http://www.arrl.org/w1aw-operating-schedule>.

To further support you in your journey, Cy has created the Facebook "GSARA CW Improvement Group" page (you can search for it in Facebook and request to 'Join' the group). It is a closed group so we can communicate issues and kudos to each other without external QRM. Finally, separate e-mails will be sent to the group from time to time with CW announcements and suggestions apart from the regular club e-mails. There may be other ways that GSARA will support this new program and we are always open to ideas and suggestions.

If you have always wanted to learn the Code but did not know where or how to start, now is your chance to learn it with the support of your friends at GSARA in a non-pressure environment.

MORE SPONSORS FOR HR-4969

The list of co-sponsors for the Amateur Radio Parity Act of 2014, **H.R. 4969**, has grown to 63.

Sixteen new co-sponsors signed aboard as the 113th Congress re-convened for its final session before adjournment. ARRL Regulatory Information Manager Dan Henderson, N1ND, is urging ARRL members to keep in contact with their Congressional representatives and to encourage them to become co-sponsors to the bill.

"We are excited about the addition of 16 new co-sponsors when Congress reconvened after the November mid-term elections," Henderson said. "Each new co-sponsor brings us one step closer to achieving our goal of getting HR 4969 enacted. We have a long way to go - but we are definitely moving in the right direction."

A few more co-sponsors may still be in the wings. The current tally represents a considerable expansion of support from the number of US Representatives who had signed aboard as Congress adjourned prior to the mid-term elections. All 16 of the latest co-sponsors were re-elected on November 4.

H.R. 4969, which was introduced in the US House of Representatives with bipartisan support in late June, would call on the FCC to apply the "reasonable accommodation" three-part test of the [PRB-1](#) federal pre-emption policy to private land-use restrictions regarding antennas. The limited PRB-1 pre-emption currently applies only to state and municipal land-use ordinances. The FCC has indicated its reluctance to provide the same legal protections from private land-use agreements -- often called covenants, conditions, and restrictions or CC&Rs -- without direction from Congress.

The League has opened a [HR.4969](#) page. HR.4969 has been referred to the House Energy and Commerce Committee. Rep Greg Walden, W7EQI (R-OR), chairs that panel's Communications and Technology Subcommittee, which will consider the measure.

NJ HAMS INVENT ANT. PLATFORM

A group of young Amateur Radio operators from Warren County in Northern New Jersey, has entered its 2013 Dayton Hamvention® Youth Forum project -- the Emergency Antenna Platform System (EAPS) -- in the [Boca Bearings Innovation Competition](#). The group, which calls itself the [721st Mechanized Contest Battalion](#), developed the device for quickly raising antennas

on vertical structures such as lamp posts and flagpoles. In an emergency, a ham radio operator could use the EAPS to put up an antenna and establish a communication link. Devlin Murray, KC2PIX, and Chris Blackwood, KD2CXC, first [presented](#) the project at Dayton. Murray and Blackwood delivered a Youth Forum presentation on robotics at the ARRL Centennial National Convention last July in Hartford, Connecticut.

"This project was inspired by Hurricane Sandy," the developers told Boca Bearing in their entry narrative. "Warren County, New Jersey, was hit fairly hard; at one point, even the county's public service communications system was knocked out. Hams pitched in to maintain communications between the various hospitals, shelters, and water distribution sites."

The group's entry relates that while setting up a communication post in a mall parking lot in Sandy's aftermath, the operators encountered reception problems. "We wanted to develop a simple system that was easily transported and deployed to raise antennas," they said. The EAPS can be powered from a vehicle battery. While initially intended for emergency use, the EAPS conceivably could be used to erect antennas for public Amateur Radio demonstrations, such as ARRL Field Day. "FREQUENCY" TV SERIES COMING

Mike Baxter, KA0XTT -- Tim Allen's character in the "Last Man Standing" TV show on ABC -- may be getting some competition on the

ham bands, as NBC appears poised to launch a television series based on the 2000 movie [Frequency](#), in which ham radio -- aided by some spectacular solar phenomena -- plays a central role in the sci-fi thriller.

According to a November 13 [article](#) in *The Hollywood Reporter*, NBC has already committed to the series. Jeremy Carver is writing the script for Warner Brothers Television and will be the series' executive producer. Toby Emmerich, who wrote the movie, will be a co-producer.

While Amateur Radio has made only fleeting appearances in "Last Man Standing," it is an essential plot device in *Frequency*. In the movie, a New York City fireman, Frank Sullivan, played by Dennis Quaid, re-connects via a bizarre ham radio link with his son, John, 30 years in the future. Jim Caviezel, now a star in the CBS drama, "Person of Interest," portrayed John Sullivan, an NYPD detective.

John Sullivan comes across his late father's 1960's-era Heathkit transceiver, through which -- with the help of a quirk of nature and some Hollywood magic -- he is able to communicate with his father through time and space. ANTARCTICA ON THE AIR

Ham radio is not the primary reason that Ron Flick, K6REF, is in Antarctica, but it's proving to be an enjoyable diversion to his scientific activities at McMurdo Station and the Ross Ice Shelf. He's put a few hundred contacts in the log since arriving late last month from California. Flick, an oceanographer and colleagues are conducting ice [vibration studies](#) on the Ross Ice Shelf, sponsored by Scripps Institution of Oceanography. McMurdo is home to KC4USV, but Flick's initial experience at the station -- once he was able to locate the key to unlock the door -- was less than optimal.

"The view is spectacular!" he enthused. "After I plugged the radio into power and the Yagi, I was able to hear a few stations on the lower end of 20, but was not able to contact anyone. The Yagi is fixed in an east-west orientation."

Flick subsequently learned that the Antarctic winds had shifted the Yagi's orientation. He'd been using 14.243 MHz -- the "usual" KC4USV frequency -- and 14.290 MHz, which he called "my personal favorite." He was also using 21.260 MHz, generally getting on the air around 2200 UTC for a few hours, depending upon his work schedule.

According to the Scripps Institution of Oceanography, Amateur Radio operations are part of the outreach and education efforts of the "Dynamic Response of the Ross Ice Shelf to Wave-Induced Vibrations" expedition.

Starting this week, Flick will be on the air as time and conditions permit as KC4/K6REF from Yesterday Camp near the International Date Line

on the Ross Ice Shelf, running 100 W to dipole antennas. He hopes to be active for a few hours during the Antarctic afternoon and evening, starting at about 0300 UTC. He will be in the field until December 5.

CHECKING BAND CONDITIONS

The purpose of this experimental Web site is to provide 24-7-365 actual (real-time) band condition information to CW QRPp, QRPe and CW/SSB for Contesters interested in increasing their scores. It can also be of benefit to other Radio Amateurs to determine band conditions for Nets and casual QSO's. This information is not based on any software predictions or any kind of satellite based readings. It is based on a new Ionospheric sounding method called "HF Ionospheric Interferometry" which operates very similarly to the PolSAR system used by NASA.

RADIO ROOM OPEN SATURDAYS

TEN YEARS AGO
