## EDITOR'S NOTES

Let's all support the White Elephant sale (see page 1) coming up on our March 2 meeting night. This is an excellent opportunity to clean out some of our "junk" and making others happy to acquire new "junk" at the sale. If you haven't done so yet, please bring items you wish to sell to the Red Cross on Saturday, February 27 between noon and 2 pm. More importantly, be sure to attend on Wednesday, March 2 at 7:30. We look forward to a huge turnout!

At the February 17 meeting (see minutes on page 3), I offered to make up custom voltmeters or ammeters from some nice 3-inch meters donated by Jeff, N2LXM. Full-scale voltages can range from 1 to 400 volts or full-scale ampere readings can range from 1 mA to 20 or 30 amps. I will replace the meter scale with a custom-printed one and furnish the necessary multiplier resistor (for voltmeters) or shunt (for ammeters) as well as a drilling template for free. So far, most interest has been in 15-volt meters (to monitor 12-volt power supplies) and/or 20 amp meters to monitor supply current for 100-watt rigs. As of this writing, there are 12 meters left. If you are interested in a custom meter or two for free, please contact me.

As noted on page 5, the Extra class exam will be modified on July 1, 2016 with some additional questions. If you've been studying from a current guide, you might want to consider taking the exam before July 1. Otherwise, you should download the new question pool and study from it.

I'd like to extend special thanks to Anthony, K2ARK for taking over the GSARA 8:30 pm Tuesday net on February 23 as I was unavailable on that night. THANK YOU. THANK YOU.

John, KA2F is ready to accept your dues for 2016 (see page 8). A bargain at \$15! Only 6 members from last year have not yet renewed. ## NEW EXTRA CLASS QUESTION POOL

The new Amateur Extra class license examination question pool, effective from July 1, 2016, through June 30, 2020, now is available at the National Conference of Volunteer Coordinators (NCVEC) website. The latest revision contains a few minor corrections that had been released in a February 5 errata of the initial January 8 release. NCVEC Question Pool Committee Chair Rol Anders, K3RA, said the new pool represents a fairly significant change relative to the current question pool, which expires on June 30.

"The primary change is modernization of the pool to place more emphasis on digital communications, digital test equipment, software defined radios, and propagation/space weather," he said. "Also, a number of other topics were added, including questions on some additional antenna types commonly used by radio amateurs." Anders said that room to cover the new topics was made in the question pool by dropping some questions that had been in the expiring pool. Read [more](#).

## ARRL PARTNERS WITH RFINDER

ARRL has established an agreement with [RFinder](#), the creator of a web and app-based directory of Amateur Radio repeaters worldwide, for RFinder to be the League's preferred online resource of repeater frequencies.

RFinder is a steadily growing worldwide repeater directory with over 50,000 repeater listings in over 170 countries. An annual \$9.99 subscription to RFinder provides access to repeater data through its collection of apps for Android and Apple devices, and from nearly any web browser. With one subscription, users have access to repeater data worldwide from computing devices on *Windows*, Mac, Linux, Android, Apple iOS, and popular GPS systems. RFinder provides integrated support for *EchoLink* on Android and iPhone, allowing users a one-click connection to repeaters worldwide from the directory.

ARRL will discontinue its own products that had supported digital listings of repeater data, including the *TravelPlus for Repeater*<sup>TM</sup> software and its own apps. ARRL is working with RFinder on a plan to migrate existing ARRL app users to RFinder, in order to support remaining subscription terms.

"Rest assured that the printed *ARRL Repeater Directory*, updated and published each year, will continue to be produced," said ARRL Marketing Manager Bob Inderbitzen, NQ1R. Inderbitzen explained that the *Repeater Directory*, available in [pocket-sized](#) and [spiral-bound desktop](#) editions, is especially popular with new radio amateurs, mobile and portable operators, and public service volunteers who rely on the printed copies when they are offline and on the go.

## ARRL SIGNS MOU WITH RED CROSS



The ARRL and the American Red Cross have signed a new *Memorandum of Understanding (MoU)*. The document, signed in January, succeeds the one agreed to in 2010; it will remain in place for the next 5 years. The *MoU* spells out how League Amateur Radio Emergency Service (ARES) volunteers will interface with the Red Cross in the event that ARES teams are asked by the Red Cross to assist in a disaster or emergency response.

"Whenever there is a disaster requiring the use of Amateur Radio communications resources and/or facilities, the local Red Cross region or chapter may request the assistance of the local ARES organization responsible for the jurisdiction of the scene of the disaster," the *MoU* provides. Such assistance would include mobilization of ARES personnel in accordance with a prearranged plan, and the establishment of communication as necessary during a disaster or emergency.

Facilitating this is a *Statement of Cooperation* to provide methods of cooperation between the two organizations on the local level in providing services to communities during or after a disaster event, "as well as other services for which cooperation may be mutually beneficial." The ARRL signatory is either the appropriate ARRL Section Manager or Section Emergency Coordinator.

The new *MoU* also clarifies that ARES volunteers assisting the Red Cross but not registered as Red Cross volunteers do not have to undergo a prior background check. Radio amateurs who register as Red Cross volunteers, though, must abide by the Red Cross's background check requirement. Read [more](#).

## PARITY ACT MOVES FORWARD

On a February 11 voice vote, the US House Subcommittee on Communications and Technology sent the Amateur Radio Parity Act, [H.R. 1301](#), to the full House Energy and Commerce Committee with a favorable report for further consideration. The measure was among three bills the Subcommittee considered during a February 11 "markup" session. The Subcommittee is chaired by Rep Greg Walden, W7EQI (R-OR).

"I'm optimistic that we can put the finishing touches on these bills in the weeks ahead and once again produce important, bipartisan legislation that protects consumers, small businesses, and access to the latest communications services," Walden said after the hearing.

Walden and the bill's sponsor, Rep Adam Kinzinger (R-IL) noted that there is common ground between proponents and opponents of the measure and that "it's important to get this done." Rep Anna Eshoo (D-CA) also spoke to recognize the work all parties have been doing to ensure the bill's passage in the House.

H.R. 1301 would direct the FCC to extend its rules relating to reasonable accommodation of Amateur Service communications to private land-use restrictions, such as deed covenants, conditions, and restrictions. The bill has attracted 120 cosponsors from both sides of the aisle. An identical US Senate measure, S. 1685, has attracted three cosponsors. It cleared the Senate Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation last November.

## HONORS TO HARRY DANNALS, W2HD

The Quarter Century Wireless Association (QCWA) has honored ARRL President Emeritus Harry Dannals, W2HD, for his 70 years as a radio amateur. QCWA Chapter 155 in Charlottesville, Virginia -- where Dannals lives -- hosted a celebratory luncheon for Dannals on February 3.

Dannals served as ARRL President from 1972 to 1982, and as President of the QCWA from 1989 to 1994 -- the only person to have been president of both organizations. While serving as

ARRL President, he was also a Commander in the US Naval Reserve. Now in his late 80s, Dannals is the oldest living former ARRL President.

In a letter, QCWA President Ken Oelke, VE6AFO, commended Dannals' contributions to Amateur Radio. Luncheon attendees also included QCWA Past President John Johnston, W3BE, and ARRL Past President Kay Craigie, N3KN. Both commented on Dannals' devoted service to the ARRL and the QCWA. Craigie said that Dannals has set an example of "cheerfulness and enthusiasm, and friendliness to all hams, whether they qualify for QCWA twice over or are so new that they haven't memorized their call signs yet."

Craigie said the luncheon was a complete surprise to Dannals.

## CHANGE IN FIELD DAY RULES

**NEWINGSTEAD, VT** — In a controversial decision, the National Radio Retransmission Legion (NRRL) will no longer accept Field Day score summaries on paper beginning next year.

The organization had no choice, says NRRL Director of Contests and Promotions Dr. Johnson Longsville. “This year we received over 1,200 hand written log entries,” says Longsville. “And about 80% of them are illegible.”

The contest director says it’s not poor hand writing which creates the issue, but food.

“This year we saw it all. One club entry was complete with smeared apple pie and Cool Whip. Another included BBQ sauce. One club even submitted an entire chicken salad sandwich with their entry...and the mayonnaise ran all over the bonus point section. Completely illegible.”

Longsville provides this breakdown of “foreign particulates” submitted with entries.

1. **Coffee and or creamer stains:** 462
2. **Cherry pie (or other fruit) filling:** 276
3. **Mustard/ketchup/alternative condiment:** 194
4. **Bacon grease and fried egg:** 143
5. **Fosters Beer:** 1

Longsville says in the future, clubs must download a 4.5 terabyte logging and score-keeping app, submit a pass code request from NRRL, and run Linux Red Hat version 2.8 on a 8GB ram desktop computer. Additionally, uploads to the NRRL computer must be made with a Level 4 VPN secure connection similar to those used in the NORAD Command Center.

“We know it’s a bit of a difficult process for most clubs to get this set up,” says Longsville. “But it’s still easier than setting up Logbook of the World.”
