TWO MORE HAMS JOIN ISS CREW

The ISS ham radio population expanded to three, following the arrival of NASA astronaut Scott Kelly and Russian cosmonauts Mikhail Kornienko, RN3BF, and Gennady Padalka, RN3DT, on March 28 (UTC). Kelly, 51, and Kornienko, 54, will remain aboard the ISS for 1 year -- the longest space mission ever assigned to a NASA astronaut.

European Space Agency Astronaut Samantha Cristoforetti, IZ0UDF, will head back to Earth in May, after Kjell Lindgren, KO5MOS; Oleg Kononenko, RN3DX, and Kimiya Yui arrive at the ISS as part of a scheduled crew rotation. Cristoforetti has conducted several Amateur Radio on the International Space Station school contacts during her ISS duty tour.

The article on page 7 about switching power supplies caught my attention. Wall warts are no longer transformer-based linear power supplies which were unlikely to radiate interference. This is something to check out if you are experiencing noise or interference on the hf bands.

ELMER PALKOWETZ, W2LSR - SK

Elmer Palkowetz, W2LSR of Brick, NJ died on April 22. He was 93. Elmer was born on February 8, 1922. While attending Columbia High School in Maplewood, NJ, he received his first amateur license in 1938 when he was issued the call, W2LSR which he held to his death.

A member of the Greatest Generation, Elmer served in the Army Air Corps during World War II. He trained at the Army Air Force Technical Training School at Sioux Falls, SD and was graduated as an honor student with an army proficiency award for copying code at 30 words a minute. In August 1943 he sailed from California to India via Tasmania and Australia as a member of the 99th Airdrome Squadron. He served at an airstrip in Sookerating, India where planes flew the hump into and out of China. In September 1944, Elmer transferred to a base at Gaya, India. When the war ended, while tuning around the short wave bands, Elmer heard amateur stations on the air operated by GIs in China, Burma and many Pacific isles. He quickly retuned an aircraft transmitter to the 20 meter band and joined in on the fun until an order came through a week later prohibiting such activities until authorized.

Elmer left Gaya, India in October 1945 and sailed through the Suez Canal and eventually across the Atlantic to New York. He had completely circled the world while in the service. He was discharged as a staff sergeant after 38 months of service, with not one visit home. His parents had never seen him in uniform until after he left the Army.

Elmer retired from Bendix as a Technician. He was predeceased by his wife and son. Surviving is his daughter. Funeral arrangements were private.

Elmer was a long time member of QCWA and strongly supported the Marconi Chapter 138 until his death. May Elmer rest in peace.

WWV STILL ON 25 MHZ

Time and frequency standard station [WWV](#) silenced its 25 MHz signal in 1977, but it returned to the air on an "experimental basis" a year ago, and it's still up and running. Resurrecting the long-dormant standard time outlet operated by the National Institute of Standards and Technology ([NIST](#)) was Matt Deutch, N0RGT, WWV's Lead Electrical Engineer.

"We have been at 1 kW for the past year," Deutch told ARRL. "We have had a few hiccups, but nothing serious." Deutch said he was pleased to see the 25 MHz signal included in a recent *QST* article, "just like the good ol' days" (see "Measuring Frequencies at VE3GSO," in the April 2015 issue of *QST*, p 37).

The return of WWV's 25 MHz outlet came about after Dean Lewis, W9WGV, lamented its loss last year in an e-mail to Deutch, who surprised him by putting the signal back on the air, initially temporarily. The 25 MHz signal not only provides another option to check your frequency calibration or the exact time, it also can serve to indicate the state of propagation on 12 and 10 meters. Deutch said the WWV 25 MHz signal still gets signal reports from across the Atlantic.



APPLY NOW FOR W1AW WAS

The [window](#) to apply for ARRL Centennial Points Challenge and W1AW Worked All States [awards](#) has been open for a month now, and the initial rush of applications has been processed. Participants' Centennial Points Challenge logs must already have been submitted via Logbook of The World ([LoTW](#)) -- the cut-off date was January 22 -- but the League will continue to



accept award applications indefinitely. With little to no backlog in the queue, it's anticipated that processing will be prompt.

The ARRL Centennial QSO Party and W1AW/portable activities in 2014 represented the biggest on-the-air operation in the history of Amateur Radio, with more than 3.5 million Centennial event contacts recorded in LoTW. W100AW operation accounted for some 70,000 contacts.

Most applicants will find the process simple and largely automated. The form will auto-populate, if ARRL has the applicant's information on file. The form may be edited to update name and address information only. The system will select the awards for which the applicant qualifies. Certificates will be printed daily. Plaques will be shipped directly from the supplier.

Certificates will be available for the Centennial Points Challenge Award, while W1AW WAS Award participants can order a certificate, a plaque, or both -- ordered separately on the website. Certificates are \$16, and plaques are \$60.

Qualifying for the Top Level Centennial Points Challenge Award requires 15,000 points. The Third Level Award requires 7500 points, while the Second and First Level awards require 3000 and 1000 points, respectively. Point totals will be printed on certificates.

HAM BALLOON CIRCLES GLOBE

A foil, party-type balloon carrying a ham radio payload has circumnavigated the globe. Launched on April 6 by Australian radio amateur Andy Nguyen, VK3YT, of Kensington, Victoria, Australia, the balloon, designated [PS-41](#), completed its round-the-world journey on April 16. It remained aloft until April 22, when Nguyen reported that it had gone down near South America. Along the way, it has been tracked by a network of Amateur Radio operators. Nguyen has been trying since early last year to have one of his launches go full circle.

"PS-41 crossed the starting longitude of 144.903 at 11:20 AM AEST (0120 UTC) this morning, completing the first PicoSpace around-the-world trip," Nguyen posted on April 16. "Thanks to everyone for assistance with tracking and providing encouragement for the project; the trip would not have been possible without you."

The solar-powered, helium-filled PS-41 balloon carried an HF payload, sending *WSPR* spots and *JT9* telemetry on 30 and 20 meters from a 25 mW transmitter. The high-altitude PS-41 took a path over Tasmania, then south of New Zealand, the southern tip of South America, directly over the South Georgia and South Sandwich islands, well south of Africa, and back across to Australia.

The balloons were extensively tracked via *JT9* by a network in Australia, New Zealand, South America, South Africa, and Ireland. *WSPR* spots were received from all over the world. -- *Thanks to Jim Linton, VK3PC*

iOS APP FOR REPEATER DIRECTORY

The ARRL Repeater Directory[®] -- introduced this week for 2015-2016 -- has a newly launched companion app for Apple[®] iOS[®] devices. iPhone[®], iPad[®] and iPod touch[®] users can download the app at no cost from Apple's [App Store](#), which requires a unique code found in each printed edition of the 2015-2016 directory to activate. Once activated, the app provides details for thousands of Amateur Radio repeaters found in *The ARRL Repeater Directory* database.

The app's database includes the current directory of frequencies included with the new 2015-2016 print editions of *The ARRL Repeater Directory* and in the *TravelPlus for Repeaters*[™] software. The database covers repeaters from 28 MHz to 1240 MHz, and includes ATV, D-STAR, APCO-25, Digital Mobile Radio (DMR), *EchoLink*, and IRLP machines.

The activation code permits single users to activate the app for 12 months. The activation codes support the iOS and Android apps found in the Apple [App Store](#) and in [Google Play](#)[™].

ARRL produced the app with DHF Systems, LLC, the developer of ARRL's *TravelPlus for Repeaters* software. There are plans to introduce a pay-and-go version of *The ARRL Repeater Directory* iOS app in the future.

SWITCHING POWER SUPPLIES NOISY

ARRL Laboratory Manager and EMI Expert Ed Hare, W1RFI, [told the HamRadioNow](#) webcast recently that switching-mode power supplies are a more common noise source for radio amateurs than electrical power lines. *HamRadioNow* host Gary Pearce, KN4AQ, interviewed Hare on April 4 at the Raleigh, North Carolina, [RARSfest](#), where Hare also presented a forum, "Tall Tales from the ARRL Lab." Hare told Pearce that switching-mode power supplies are in -- or provide power for -- many home electronics these days.

"The old days of those iron transformers are gone," Hare said. "Every single one of these is a switcher. We're also seeing noise from pulse-width control motors." Hare said the big culprits are "little wall warts," not switching supplies designed to power Amateur Radio gear. "Every TV you own has a built-in switcher, almost every device has a wall wart, and a lot of these are imported, not necessarily meeting the FCC rules, so we're seeing more reports involving those," he said.

Hare also told *HamRadioNow* that a few LED-type lightbulbs that are becoming more common also can be noise-generators, as are "grow lights" used for cultivating plants indoors. He said that the ARRL Lab can work with manufacturers to correct these problems, but the Lab needs model numbers and "specific information about the problems amateurs are having, so that we can put some of our resources toward helping."


Many interference issues can be resolved without FCC intervention, Hare said, noting that Commission enforcement is the last step, if other efforts fail. "We've been told by Laura Smith [of the FCC Enforcement Bureau] that she's going to continue to be engaged in this," he said, "so we're going to continue to send problems [in] that direction."
